Test Descriptions

Stanford Achievement Test, 10th Edition

Annual Standardized Achievement examination administered to all K-8th grade students. Core subjects will be tested. Scoring charge is paid by CHCS.

PSAT/NMSQT

Preliminary SAT-National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test. Available to all 9th, 10th, & 11th grade students. \$20 scoring & material fee—Registration deadline, August 28th.

PLAN

Preliminary ACT exam. A comprehensive guidance resource that helps students measure their current academic development, explore career/training options, and make plans for the remaining years of high school and post-graduation years. Sample questions online at www.act.org/plan. Available to 10th grade students only. Scoring charge is paid by CHCS.

EXPLORE

Educational Planning & Assessment by ACT. Students' strengths and weaknesses can be identified early in their educational development when they have the greatest opportunity to establish a four-year program of studies that will help them achieve their career and educational goals. Available to 9th grade students only. Scoring charge is paid by CHCS.

ASVAB

A nationally -normed multi-aptitude test battery that links with the Career Exploration Program. This exam will be given to assist the student with career planning. Available to 11th grade students. Free of charge.

CLEP

College Level Examination Program. A credit-by-examination program where students can earn credit for what they already know, regardless of how that knowledge was acquired. By receiving a satisfactory score, students can earn a score from 3—12 college credits toward a college degree for each CLEP exam taken, depending on the exam subject and the policy of the college or university they attend.
